You have no doubt heard it, and perhaps you have even said it:

- Everything happens for a reason.
- God helps those who help themselves.
- God won't give you more than you can handle.
- God said it, I believe it, that settles it.
- Love the sinner, hate the sin.

Sound familiar? As pastor and author Adam Hamilton puts it, "Most of us as Christians have things we believe, and tell others, and even count on, that we've not carefully examined. Some of the things we accept and repeat to others sound so true, and we've believed them for so long, that they become ... 'sacred cows'—things above question or criticism."<sup>1</sup> When questioned about their accuracy, we get irritated or even defensive.

Over four decades of ministry, I have noted a declining interest in Bible study, especially on the personal level. Perhaps we have succumbed to cultural influences without realizing it: it is easier to let a religious personality on television, or a Sunday school teacher or a preacher tell us what God expects or what the Bible says, than it is for us to spend time studying on our own. As a result, we have trouble telling someone else why we believe what we believe.

We might start with, "Because the Bible says so..." without knowing where the scripture is or the context in which it was written. Both are important; however, quoting scriptures without understanding the entire passage or knowing who originally was being addressed and what their cultural setting was, leads to misinterpreting the message.

With this in mind, during the season of Lent, I plan to share a series of sermons addressing the sayings listed at the top of this article. You might be thinking about how you have heard and used such sayings, and consider what is true – and not true – about them.

Lent is a season for serious reflection and self-examination. It is a time for asking God to put us "under the microscope" and help us see who we are and where we need to change and grow. Examination of these and other half truths may challenge our faith but will lead us to the greater truths taught by Jesus Christ.

I look forward to our time together!

### Altar & Narthex Flowers for 2018


